THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WOLLASTON

BY-LAW NO: 7-88

Being a by-law to provide for the
licensing and control of dogs in the
Township of Wollaston.

WHEREAS Council is authorized to pass a by-law pursuant
to The Dog Licensing and Livestock and Poultry Protection Act,
R.S.O. 1980, c. 123:

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the
Township of Wollaston ENACTS as follows:

1. In this By-Law:
 - (a) "dogs" means a male or female dog:
 - (b) "owner" of a dog includes a person who possesses or harbours a dog, and "owns" and "owned" have a corresponding meaning:
2. (a) The running at large of dogs within the Municipality of Wollaston is prohibited and the owner of any dog which is found running at large within the said Municipality shall be guilty of an offence under this by-law and liable on conviction to the penalty provided in Section 8 hereof.
 - (b) Any Dogs caught running at large in in the Municipality may be seized, impounded and or destroyed (killed) whether before or after impounding, by any police officer or such officer or persons designated by the Township.
 - (c) For the purpose of this section a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when found on a highway or in any other public place and not under control of any person.
3. Where any person finds a dog running at large contrary to the provisions of this by-law and the dog is in the act of attacking or threatening to attack a human being, he may kill the dog.
4. No damage or compensation shall be recovered for the killing of a dog under this section, R.R.O. 1970. Reg. 226, S 5 revised.
5. A by-law enforcement officer in the Township of Wollaston may:
 - (a) seize and impound any dog found running at large
 - (b) in his discretion, restore possession of the dog found running at large and
 - (c) the owner claims possession of the dog within seven days after the date of seizure, and

(d) the owner pay to the By-Law Enforcement officer expenses incurred in caring for and feeding the dog.

6. Where a by-law enforcement officer is unable to seize a dog that is running at large contrary to the provisions of this by-law, he may kill the dog.


7. Where a by-law enforcement officer finds a dog running at large contrary to the provisions of this by-law and he believes that before he can seize the dog it may attack a human being, he may kill the dog.

Section 4 of this By-Law applies to the By-Law Enforcement Officer.


8. Every owner of a dog who allows it to run at large contrary to Section 2 of this By-Law is guilty of an offence and on summary conviction is liable a fine of fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for the first offence, Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) for the second offence and Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for the third and subsequent offence, exclusive of costs,

9. Any By-Law in conflict with the above is hereby repealed.

Read a first, second and third time this 4th day of March, 1988.
