BY-LAW NO. 23-94

Being a By-Law to establish a Plan of Sick Leave for employees and recinding By-Law NO: 9-80 and all other sick leave By-laws prior to this date.


WHEREAS Section 352, Sub-Section 65 of the Municipal Act provides that Municipalities may establish a Plan of Sick Leave for its Employees as defined thereof;


NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Wollaston enacts as follows:

ON THE first day of each year each "Permanent" employee shall receive an allotment of six days for sick leave benefits. This sick leave may be used at any time during the current year but may not be accumulated for any following years. However any employee during adsence from work due to illness is entitled to payment of days accumulated under By-Law NO. 9-77, but not to exceed payment for the time accumulated by that employee up to and including May 31st. 1980.

UPON TERMINATION after May 31st, 1980 no compensation shall be paid for unused sick days. All sick leave accumulated under By-law 9-77 shall be honoured (on termination of his/her employment the employee is entitled to payment at his current rate for one-half of the number of days accumulated up to May 31st, 1980).
