BY-LAW NO. 27-94

Being a By-Law to recind By-Law # 25-94. This is a By-Law to lay down conditions to bring Clerk up to full Pay Equity.

Using the Road Foreman and Clerk as comparators and deciding them to be equal.


The Clerk shall begin work in January of 1994 using a hourly wage base of \$13.79 and shall be brought up to equality with the Road Foreman as follows:

The starting rate shall be 60% of the base or better. After one year it shall be 75% or better. After two years it shall be 90% or better and after three years it shall be equal.


On top of this the Clerk shall also receive any wage raise the foreman gets in it's entirety.
