Good afternoon;

On behalf of the Town of Bancroft (Town), I am contacting North Hastings municipalities with respect to future participation with the Town for the Municipal Hazardous or Special Waste (MHSW; formerly referred to as Household Hazardous Waste or HHW) program plan. This email is a follow-up to a discussion had with most of you at the September 18th County Clerks and Treasurer's meeting.

As most of you know, Stewardship Ontario (SO), on behalf of Waste Diversion Ontario (WDO), is administering a phased program plan that in general, provides a mechanism for the reimbursement of costs incurred by municipalities for MHSW events in their municipalities/regions in a concerted effort to divert these harmful materials from being landfilled in our sensitive waste sites.

At present, SO is encouraging municipalities that hosted events in 2008 (after July 1st), to enter into agreements with SO in order for 2008 costs to be eligible for funding reimbursement. As the Town hosted these events for the region, they are intending to enter into an agreement with SO before the December 15th, 2008 deadline, for 2008 event reimbursements, as available. As part of the SO agreement process, is the ability of a host municipality to include others in the region for on-going services basically consistent with those provided by the Town in 2008 and in previous years.

In order for the Town to appropriately include each of your municipalities on their agreement with SO, it would be prudent to receive your concurrence with the above approach. In terms of cost, the Town would be responsible for managing costs incurred and subsequent reimbursements to individual municipalities, providing a "one (1) window" approach. As in the past, the number of attendees at each event from a partner municipality would be recorded by the MHSW staff, and this provides an estimate of each participating municipality's "share" for each event.

Please respond to this message at your earliest convenience with your municipality's position with regard to continuing to be a partner municipality with the Town for MHSW events. Please note that if you do participate with the Town, and choose not to in the future, we understand that there are no binding elements within the agreement. SO wants to ensure that all municipalities are covered, whether as individuals, or under a regional program.

Is the Town of Bancroft planning to continue MHSW collection for 2009 and beyond?

As part of the agreement with Stewardship Ontario the Town of Bancroft will include the service area of the Township of Wollaston. This agreement is for three years.

Will a private firm and not Quinte waste Solutions be hired to run the events?

Quinte Waste Solutions will no longer be providing any MHSW services through this agreement.

Will there be an opportunity to expand this service example the collection of e-waste is not currently part of this program?

As of April 2009 there will be funding available for e-waste collection through Stewardship Ontario. Tyler believes this will be collection at the source possibly individual landfill sites. If this turns out not to be the case than, they may consider the collection of E-waste with MHSW.

Are you currently aware of any additional costs associated with this proposal for the municipalities?

Not sure how costs will be distributed for future events may be actual usage or percentage of population. Whichever the costs are distributed the rebates will be distributed in the same manner. The costs will be invoiced directly from the Town of Bancroft after the events and rebates will follow at a later date. WDO funding is usually at least a year behind. Example rebates for 2008 won't probably be received till late 2009 or early 2010. He doesn't expect any significant cost differences especially since things like advertising are eligible for funding.

Will the town of Bancroft be using an approved transporter of 2009 to take full advantage of the funding opportunities?

Yes

Will the Municipalities be signing a formal agreement with the Town of Bancroft?

Not at this time. This is just an agreement of understanding to proceed with funding for 2008. A formal agreement maybe required to finalize future costs and rebate distribution.

If the Town of Bancroft in the future decides to open permanent MHSW facility would we be given consideration in its use?

The Town of Bancroft is looking at the possibility of a permanent facility at their landfill site to be operated seasonally. Mr. Peters will bring up my question at the next committee meeting.

What are the other Municipalities that you contacted doing in regards to this proposal?
Since he has not asked for a formal agreement he will be following up with Clerks this week.
